## Revised Rules/Regulations

Effective April 1, 2011

### Article I – Cemetery General Policy

#### Section 1 – General

☐ Bath Township Cemeteries are maintained and operated as non-profit ground and mausoleum interment facilities and are nonsectarian.

☐ Cemeteries are open from dawn to dusk.

☐ Cemetery is responsible only for marker and item installed to township specifications and approval per Ohio Revised Code.

#### Section 2 – Visitations

☐ Cemetery grounds are sacred and devoted to the burial of the dead.

☐ No visitor is permitted to carry or use tools in cemetery or do any work in the cemetery without the permission of the Board of Trustees or Operations Supervisor.

☐ No pets shall be allowed in cemetery at any time.

☐ All visitors' vehicles shall remain on drives and not park in the grass.

☐ All debris, discarded flowers or decorations shall be placed in trash containers.

☐ Artificial flowers may be placed on graves (in the grass) between Nov. 1 and Mar. 1 ONLY!

☐ Visitors are not permitted to remove, cut, deface or destroy cemetery property.

#### Section 3 – Interments

☐ All in ground interments in cemetery "grave space" facilities must be enclosed in an outer container (vault) approved for burial purposes.

**TOP SEAL/CONCRETE VAULTS ONLY! FLAT TOPS NOT PERMITTED!**

☐ Bath Township permits ONLY cemetery employees to do the work of digging and covering graves for funerals. Under no circumstances will the general public or families be permitted to perform this work.

#### Section 4 – Resale of Lot By Individuals

☐ A lot owner may dispose of his/her holdings to a second party by sale or transfer with the notification of the Operations Supervisor or Sales Clerk. Lots can be sold only for the original purchase price or less. It is against the law to sell holdings for profit. Byron Cemetery does not buy back lots after the original sale.

### Article II – Interments

#### Section 1 – Burials

☐ All remains can be permanently memorialized at Bath Township Cemetery by being deposited in an interment space in the earth or above ground in a mausoleum or columbarium.

☐ Only human remains will be interred in Bath Township Cemetery. (no pets or animal remains)

#### Section 2 – Cremated Remains

☐ Cremated remains in an urn may be buried in a grave space in the earth or in a cremation niche above ground. Under no circumstances will the cemetery scatter human remains.

### Article III – Decorations

#### Section 1

☐ Planting of flowers, flower pots or bushy plants is strictly prohibited.

#### Section 2

☐ Cutting and trimming grass is one of the largest and most costly maintenance activities of your cemetery. For economy of maintenance during growing season, (Mar. 1 thru Nov. 1) it is required that NO flowers or decorations may be placed in the grass, on top of graves or around the headstone foundations to allow for mowing and trimming.

#### Section 3

☐ The cemetery shall have the right to remove all floral designs, flowers and other decorations of any kind from the cemetery if, in the judgment of the Operations Supervisor, they do not conform to the standards set forth herein.

#### Section 4

☐ The placing of boxes, shells, toys, metal designs, ornaments, chairs, vases, glass, plastic flowers or wires of any kind, wood or iron cases, glass and plastic blocks, artificial animals, tin cans, crockery, waste baskets, pails, cardboard cartons and the like, will not be permitted on cemetery grave spaces.

☐ Shepherds hooks and eternal flames are not permitted unless installed in the concrete foundation out of the way of trimmers and mowers. They are not permitted to be stuck in the ground around the foundations.

#### Section 5

☐ During mowing season decorations placed on the graves are permitted only for 5 days on holidays (Easter, Mother's Day, Memorial Day, etc.) The cemetery will remove any decorations left after this time so that maintenance can be performed. No exceptions.

#### Section 6

☐ Winter decorations, such as natural wreaths placed on easels and other approved arrangements such as grave blankets will be permitted from Nov. 1 to Mar. 1 ONLY.

☐ Winter decorations will be removed when they become unsightly.

☐ All winter and Christmas decorations will be removed March 1<sup>st</sup>.

#### Section 7

☐ Glass vases are strictly prohibited. All vases and urns must be securely fastened down to prevent the wind from blowing flowers around the cemetery.

#### Section 8

☐ Mausoleum: No decorations of any kind may be attached to the mausoleum building, including pictures, flowers, vases, plastic ornaments, etc. Decorations may be placed around the base of the building on holidays only for a maximum of 1 week.

### Article IV – Monuments

#### Section 1

☐ Markers or monuments must be on a foundation conforming to township specifications. No foot stones permitted except as a marker flush to the ground.

#### Section 2

☐ Only one grave marker shall be placed on any grave with the exception of VA markers. Additional markers for multiple interments are at the discretion of the Operations Supervisor.

#### Section 3

☐ All foundations must be built by and in accordance with the specifications of the cemetery at the expense of the lot owner. No contractors or general public will be permitted to do concrete work.

#### Section 4

☐ As weather permits, orders for foundations should be given to the Operations Supervisor or Sales Clerk one month in advance of the installation. No order for installation of a foundation may be acted on until specifications and certification of payment have been received by the Sales Clerk. No guarantee of footer completion no less than 90 days.

#### Section 5

☐ All monuments delivered to the cemetery must be handled by insured monument companies only. No stone can be handled by the cemetery employees.

### Article V – Construction Work

#### Section 1

☐ Monuments and construction material shall not be brought into the cemetery until all preparatory work on the lot has been completed and further work shall proceed promptly.

### Article VI – Lots & Grave Care

#### Section 1

☐ The purchase price of your lot provides for regular care which includes such services as scheduled grass mowing, trimming, tree and shrubbery trimming, seeding and fertilizing and road maintenance. Owner cannot expect special or preferential treatment of their lots beyond such scheduled services. The cemetery always wants to see its lot owners well satisfied with lot care, but must make a charge for any extra services beyond normally scheduled services.

☐ Planting of trees, flowers and shrubs on top of or next to graves or headstones is strictly prohibited!
